Each year MHHC Foundation awards scholarships to deserving college-bound youths who embody the values of essential leadership, community service and pursuit of scholastic excellence. These values are critical indicators to a successful college career. Proceeds from the Annual Impact Awards Gala are designated to fund the Scholarship Program.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Be a patient of Morris Heights Health Center, a child of a MHHC employee, or a student with a MHHC school based health center.
- Must be a graduating high school senior.
- Maintain a least 2.8 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale. Please send in current transcript or end of the year transcript.
- Conduct at least 20 hours of community service with a local organization. Please verify by sending in Proof of community service hours.
- Must submit 2 letters of recommendations from teachers, religious leaders, or political representatives.
- Submission of a 4-5 page typed, double-spaced essay, size 12, Times New Roman Font, on (see essay prompt).
- Be accepted for admission at an approved accredited institution of higher education in a Program of study that leads to a degree.
- Provide a copy of the acceptance letter and certification of enrollment issued from a two or four year college or university.

Social Work and other Public Services Supporting Our Community

Often, we hear people say that giving back is more fulfilling than receiving. There is no better way to experience the joy of giving than providing services to your community and making a difference to society through service. Creating change and encouraging resilience in individuals, families, and communities is one of the primary goals of a Social Worker and other public service providers.

We promote social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment of people within communities. These services are provided in hospitals, Mental Health facilities, child welfare and community service agencies, community development organizations, schools, halfway houses, adoption agencies, health centers, and political offices. Finding ways to encourage Wealth-Equity so that all individuals, families, and communities have the same opportunity, is our current goal.

Social Workers and other public service providers are the people who have identified the need to establish private and charitable organizations to serve people in need. They have established Federally Qualified Health Centers to provide affordable and quality medical care to communities that are undeserved. Many of the benefits that we have today are because Social Workers – working with families and institutions – spoke out against the abuse and neglect. Social Workers led groundbreaking changes in the following:

- The civil rights of all people regardless of gender, race, faith, or sexual orientation are protected.
- Workers enjoy unemployment insurance, disability pay, workers' compensation and Social Security.
- People with mental illness and developmental disabilities are now afforded humane treatment.
- Medicaid and Medicare give poor, disabled and elderly people access to health care.
- Society seeks to prevent child abuse and neglect.
- Treatment of mental illness and substance abuse is gradually losing its stigma.

Today, there is one teen who is trying to find a way to make the New York City subway system accessible to all people. There are children delivering free books to other children so that everyone has an opportunity to read and further their education.

The Social Work and public service path is that of civil rights activist, social justice warrior, family advocate, suffragist and community leader. Be the next one to lead our society to new understanding of what it means to be human.
